## **THE WOMEN IN SCIENCE AND ENGINEERING RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM (WISE) DEAN BARROWS SCHOLARSHIP**

Two \$200 scholarships will be awarded to incoming first year WISE students. Students selected for awards will be expected to be actively engaged in the WISE community. This includes enrollment in the Fall WISE seminar, InterAg 175, participation in the Opening Welcome Retreat and other WISE activities. **Application Instructions:** This application is for students admitted to UW-Madison who have indicated their preference (having returned a University Housing contract) to live in Women in Science and Engineering Residential Program, located in Sellery Hall, for the 2009-2010 academic year. Only those assigned to WISE will be eligible for a scholarship.

**We encourage you to submit your University Housing Contract Acceptance and deposit and choose WISE** as your first choice when you submit your housing preferences. This award is contingent on your acceptance to UW-Madison and your assignment to the Women in Science and Engineering Residential Program in Sellery Hall. Completing the scholarship application does not guarantee placement into the WISE Residential Program in Sellery Hall.

This scholarship application process is separate from any other financial aid application processes administered by the UW-Madison Office of Student Financial Services or any other source. We encourage you to visit [www.finaid.wisc.edu](http://www.finaid.wisc.edu) for information on the UW-Madison financial aid process.

The criteria for allocating scholarships include: financial need, academic achievement, personal qualifications, career interest, and major or program interest. The WISE scholarship committee selects the award recipients after assignments are finalized. Assignments will be mailed on approximately May 30, 2008. Scholarships will be awarded by July 1, 2009.
